Bienestar Promotores 2008 - 2009

Message from Executive Director Karen Shawcross

We are proud to present this report on our Promotores Program for 2008-2009. We were thrilled in this 4th year of the program to have it honored by United Way of the Columbia Willamette, naming Bienestar 2008 Community Partner of the Year!

Promotores are residents of Bienestar properties who are selected for their leadership potential and who then receive special training, coaching, mentoring from staff. Their training includes learning about community resources that can help our resident families with challenges and barriers in their daily lives. They also receive training in how to conduct home visits, or pláticas, and some of the disciplined practices of trained social workers. Most of the Promotores are also participating in our ESL, GED, financial literacy, and computer classes.

Each Promotor/a conducts 40 home visits (pláticas) annually with residents in the community where they live. These pláticas lie at the heart of the Promotores project, and are interactive, peer-to-peer outreach sessions in which Promotores share information, model problem-solving skills, and make referrals to appropriate services so that language and cultural barriers do not prevent those who need assistance from finding it.

The goal is to develop community capacity for self-sufficiency by providing information, resources, and education in health, education, parenting, employment, food, financial literacy, etc. through home visits and presentations. This year they made 602 home visits and 175 referrals.

This year we had 15 Promotores as we were able to expand to Sierra West, Sunset Gardens, and Willow Park Apartments in Hillsboro and Forest Grove. We welcomed back 5 Promotores and trained 10 new ones. The Promotores Advisory Board continues to meet quarterly, and we are very grateful for the support of these wonderful partners.

This program allows us to stay closely attuned to the needs of our residents in real time and to develop programs and resources that meet those needs in a rapidly changing environment. This year we have seen a return to basic needs—food, shelter and clothing - as families living on the edge try to weather the economic crisis. In response we have implemented a new Rapid Re-employment program, expanded our basic skills offerings like ESL, GED and basic computer classes, and tightened and developed community partnerships with helping agencies like Oregon Food Bank, Northwest Children's Outreach, Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Clinic, Essential Health Clinic, Community Action. It is our hope to keep our families safe in Bienestar communities in these challenging times.

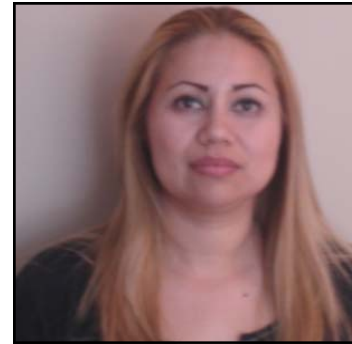
My message to others is to give themselves a chance to know about the wonderful opportunity of becoming a Promoter and to help the families connect to resources in the community.
